Pathways, plans and paperwork.

Right now businesses, community groups and individuals are reading reports and studying the fine print to help navigate their way through the world of COVID19.

Business owners have to provide a safe working environment and have a legal obligation to have a regularly updated COVIDSafe plan.

They are also now obliged to keep a 'workplace attendance record' of their employees so that if their business becomes an exposure site, the people at risk can be told as soon as possible.

The DHHS website has a template for a COVIDSafe plan that makes it easier to work out a business can operate in accepted protocols.

There has been, and will be, a lot of discussion around requests for people to offer proof of their vaccination status.

The Waterline News has received reports of shop keepers and staff being disrespected as they check shoppers IDs. Providing proof of vax status is likely to be a constant inconvenience so there is a greater need for patience on both sides of the counter than ever.

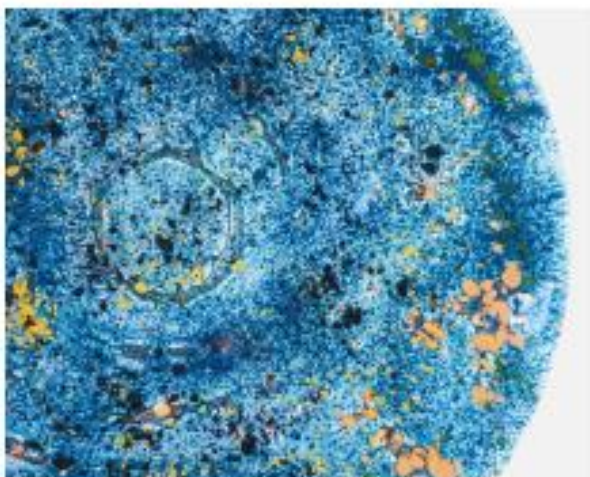

The Bass Valley Community Centre has continued to make its way through the trials and tribulations of Covid 19 restrictions, ducking and weaving the successions of lockdown. With what may be seen by some as pure optimism, we have set the date for our AGM as Tuesday 26th October. It is a public meeting and we would welcome all interested in attending, commencing at 2:00. We will of course have Zoom access to the meeting for those who would rather be attending remotely.

The past year has had a number of positives despite the pandemic. In the first instance the Centre benefitted from the State Government's Jobs Victoria, Working for Victoria program. This program auspiced by the Bass Coast Council, meant that the Centre had access to a number of workers who produced some quite remarkable improvements at the Centre. Works extended from painting the inside of the Bass Hall to putting downpipes on the Hadden House op shop shed.

It wasn't all out-door work either, with a shared project with the Corinella Community Centre that led to a review and revision of the policies and procedures both organisations are dependent on for their operations.

We had significant support from the Commonwealth Government too, with the Australian Tax Office chipping in \$10,000.

However our biggest success was with the Hadden House op shop which made a record amount in support of the Centre.

It seemed that each time a lockdown finished, the op shop was inundated with customers, resulting in record incomes on many days.

We extend an enormous thank you to our volunteers who staff the shop and the general community who have been avid in their support.

In looking ahead, we are very mindful that the way forward may be fraught. Many of our clients are frail and suffering from a range of debilities.

As the State and country open up and the strains of Covid becomes a part of life like the annual flu we are hoping that the cost doesn't settle too oppressively on the most vulnerable.

With some good summer weather we should be able to approach the next winter with better times for all concerned.

Ah, motorbikes.

Bike riding for me was that total freedom with the wind whistling through your ears.

BASS COAST HEALTH

We wanted to update you on two key changes at Wonthaggi Hospital effective Monday 11th, 2021. The first change is that we are **closing the front entrance of the Hospital** via Graham Street, and are requiring everyone to enter via the rear of the site from Baillieu Street West. The second is that we are **opening a new Emergency Department** in Armitage House to expand our capacity and meet the predicted surge in activity.

In relation to the Hospital access, you will have noticed that the Wonthaggi Hospital Expansion is progressing and we are moving closer to a new and improved Emergency Department, theatre and inpatient areas. All of the foundations and most of the structures and utilities are in place and the Emergency Services access road via the Rose Lodge fence line is complete. A focus for Kane Constructions now is creating the new carpark at the front of the hospital which will give us around 40 additional car parks including 9 Disabled car parks. To facilitate this, the current front car park and current front door will be closed, and a temporary new main entrance has been set up at the rear of Wonthaggi Hospital. This will open from 5am on Monday the 11th October and will be accessible via Baillieu Street West. All cars will be stopped at a Concierge hub in Baillieu Street West where people will meet our BCH Traffic Management team who will direct vehicles promptly to their destination. The Concierge hub will operate 24/7. Parking for visitors to the main hospital will be in Kirrak car park, and, members of the public will walk via our marked pathway, around to the new reception area near our Theatre Door and Supply Building where we will screen people before they are guided into the main hospital.

The second change (and highlight) is that a full renovation of Armitage House is now complete with thanks to TS Constructions, and this area has been set up ready for additional emergency capacity in light of the anticipated Pandemic surge. Our usual Emergency Department will continue to operate. Both EDs can be accessed via Baillieu St and there will be traffic control in place to direct all patients and visitors.

I am also keen to let you know that our Wonthaggi Testing tent has been relocated to the old Secondary school site and access is via Watts Street. As always, please encourage your colleagues and families to get tested if they have any symptoms. Of, and of course, please pop in to get vaccinated at the Town Hal, or at your local GP or Pharmacy – this is the most important thing we can do to make sure we all have a close to normal Christmas!!

Thanks as always to you all for your support as we do everything we can to keep our community safe.

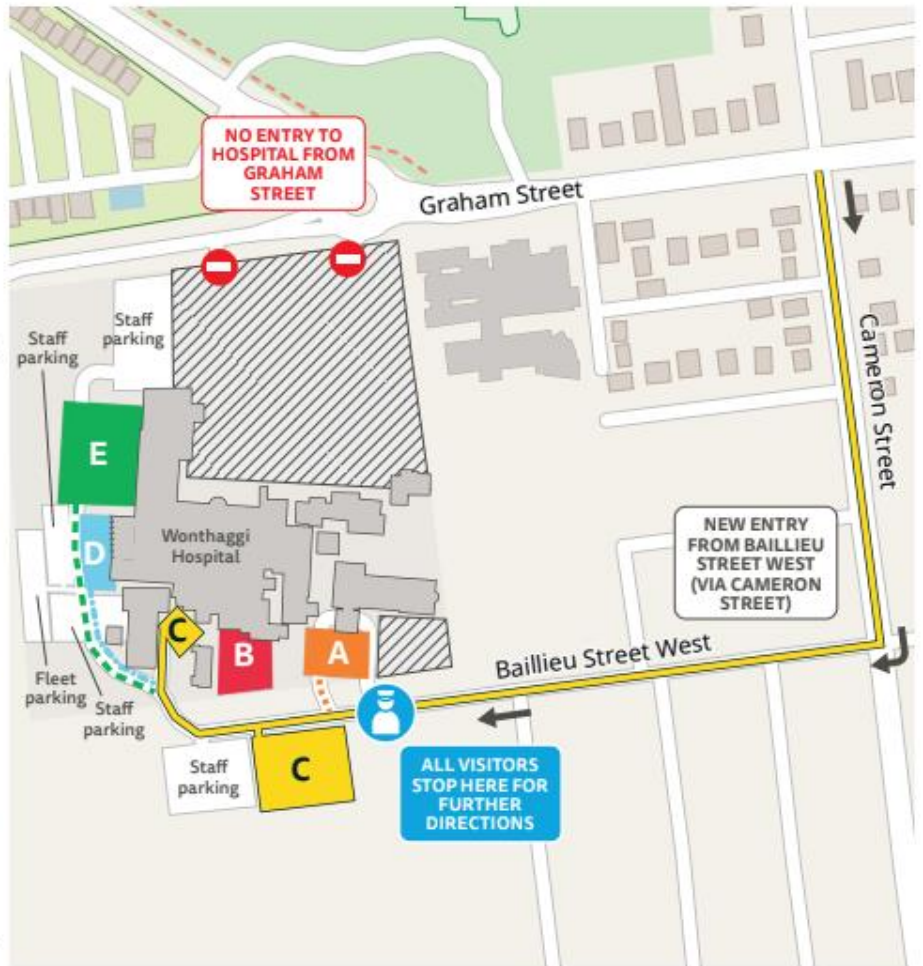
Wonthaggi Hospital Changed Car Parking Arrangements

-  E. Ambulatory Care parking

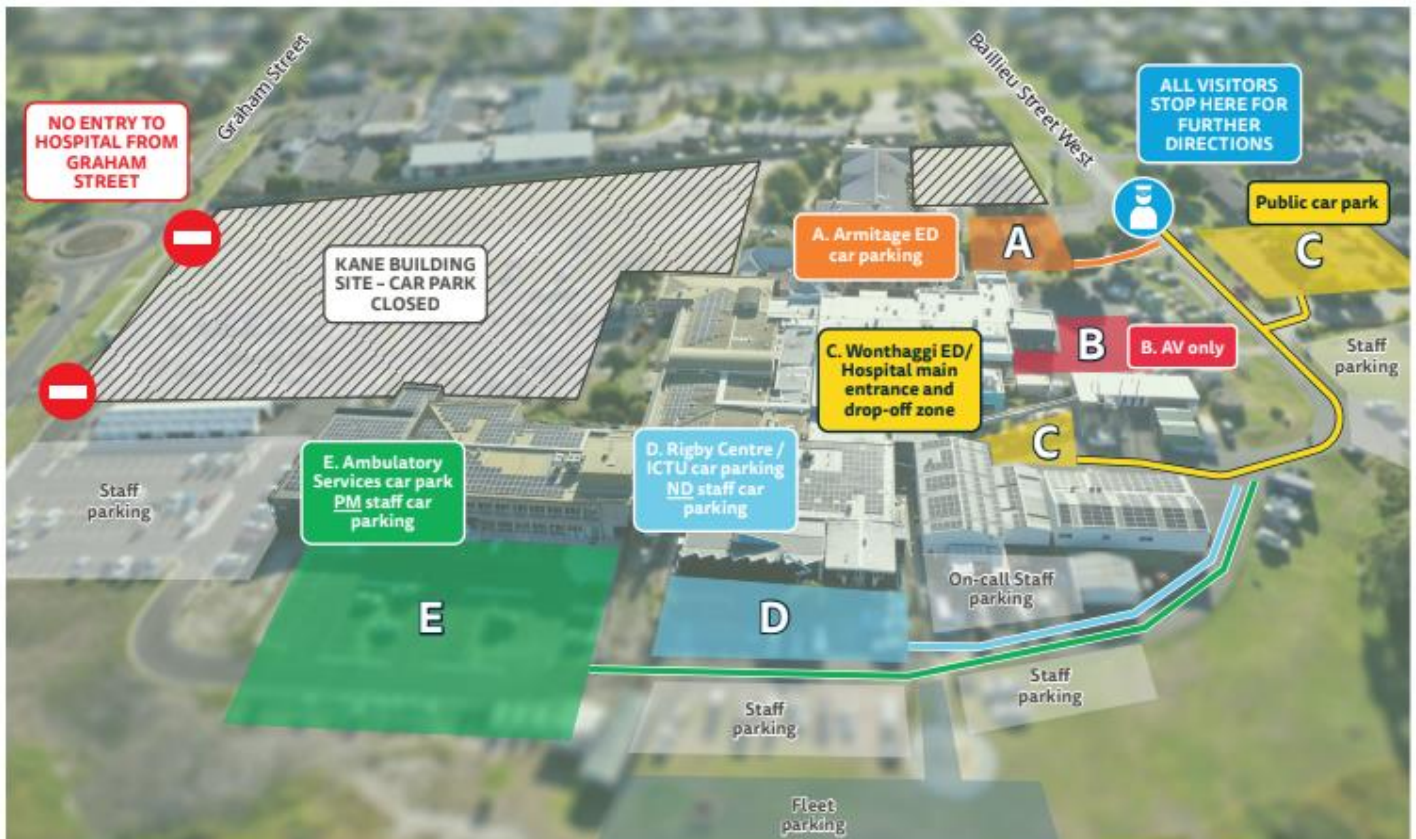

Wonthaggi Hospital Changed Car Parking Arrangements

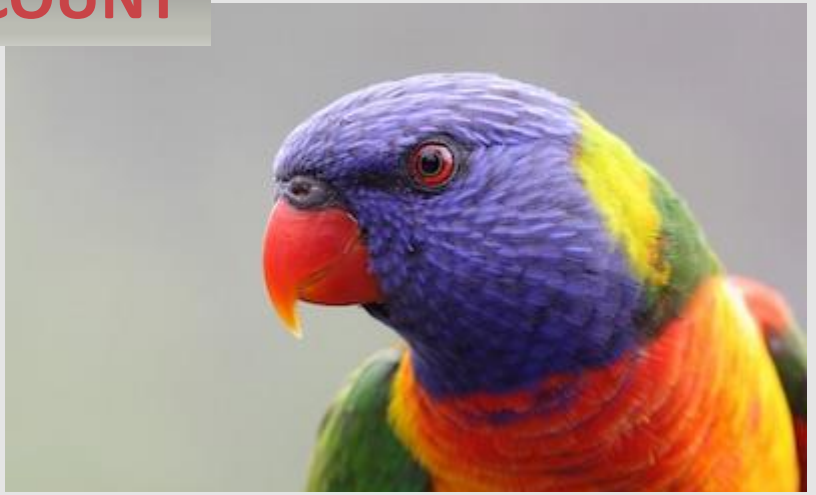

GREAT AUSSIE BIRD COUNT

Are you ready for the Aussie Backyard Bird Count, 2021?

Bird supporters across the country will be taking part in the Aussie Backyard Bird Count between the 18th and the 24th of October



Last year, over 108,000 Aussies counted nearly 4.6 million birds, with the Rainbow Lorikeet coming out on top as Australia's most counted bird.

Sadly, it wasn't all good news, with small birds continuing to face great challenges across Australia.

"Smaller bush birds are losing out in urban areas due to the loss of richness and diversity of habitat as urban sprawl and infill development reduces wild urban spaces.

"With fewer bushy gardens for these small birds to retreat to, we are losing them from our cities," reported BirdLife Australia's National Public Affairs Manager, Sean Dooley.

"The downward trend may also be due to the rise of larger and more aggressive birds, in particular the Noisy Miner which can drive away smaller birds."

Participation in this year's Count will enable bird experts to determine if these trends are continuing for declining species.

Your count will help BirdLife Australia to determine the reasons for the decline.

It's a great way to connect with the birds in your backyard, no matter where your backyard happens to be. You can count in a suburban backyard, a local park, a patch of forest, down by the beach, or the main street of town. In fact, you don't even have to leave home, so it's an amazing Covid-safe activity!

All you need is 20 minutes in your favourite outdoor space, and you're ready to take part.

You can submit your Aussie Backyard Bird Count via the app and use the Field Guide function to help you identify the birds you see. Just enter the size, shape and colour of the bird and it will give you a list of suggestions that are relevant for your region.

It is a really fabulous tool for beginner birdwatchers – a great way to get your friends and family hooked on watching and counting birds!
